John Mark's family is the owner of the <u>upper room</u> used both for Jesus's last Passover and for the gathering on Pentecost.

Many believe that John Mark is the <u>rich</u>, young ruler. Mark 10:17ff

It is also very likely that he is the young man that ran away on the night Jesus was <u>betrayed</u>. Mark 14:51

John Mark's lack of faith stands in sharp contrast to his family but it appears that at last he comes to true faith in <u>Christ</u>.

Mark's faith is <u>real</u> so he accompanies Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey, but his faith is weak so he abandons them and returns home.

He becomes the focal point of a heated argument about who should go on the second <u>mission</u> trip. Acts 15:36ff

By the time the New Testament era comes to a conclusion, he is called the son of Peter and the trusted <u>companion</u> of Paul. 2 Peter 4:10; Philemon 24

He is the first to write a <u>narrative</u> of the life of Jesus—called the Gospel of Mark.
